The upcoming activity will be a tour of Dickinson College's new science complex, which is currently under construction. Plan to meet at the corner of North College and West Louthers Streets. The only available parking is along city streets, so please allow extra time to find parking.

The new complex, completion of which is anticipated in 2008, will showcase new fields in science, new teaching methods and new discoveries for Dickinson College. The building we will be touring is one of two new facilities which together provide 150,000 square feet at an estimated total cost of \$50 million. The complex will feature laboratories, classrooms, lab preparation areas, seminar rooms, a large lecture hall with full audio-visual capacity, faculty offices, administrative-support areas, spaces for student-faculty research, the planetarium and observatory, reading room and student study area, instrument storage and repair facilities, and equipment fabrication and storage facilities.
